a federal highway. The inn is now but a farmhouse, and the eighty acres of land which produced wheat and rye, meat and poultry for the public use, has become but one of many fertile farms of Caledonia township. Peter Schmitz, youngest of the family, has resided there for many years. Many changes have come to the famous old inn. Windows with their small square panes have long been replaced by more modern ones, and today a spacious porch has changed the appearance of the place. But in the memory of the older settlers, the hospitality of the former inn and gathering place for hundreds will never fade.
